"If we are painstaking about this phase of our development"

These, of course, are the opening words of "The Promises" as read at so many meetings. Let's look at what they say:

First Word "IF" — granting or supposing that; on condition

that.

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IF: Big word. It tells me that t here is a condition placed on the Promises.

They won't come to me unless I meet the condition of painstaking.

Second Word "We" — in this context is the universal form.

"We" is used here because the Big Book was written to explain what the early AA members (plural) did to get sober.

Yes, each individual person did the work for themselves. **"I"** had to have

be painstaking in working steps One through Nine. I had serious work to do if I wanted these promises.

Fourth Word "PAINSTAKING" — expending or showing diligent care and effort; careful.

For most of us, a sponsor leads us forward in this effort. The sponsor has achieved the promises, knows the peace and serenity of this achievement and wants us to know it also.

My sponsor gave me her time and shared her experience. She was very patient with me. In following her suggestions and doing the "homework" she assigned, I worked hard. I did put forth the effort.

Fifth Word "PHASE" — a part or

step in a process: one part in a series of related events or actions

Certainly I went through "phases" in my drinking career. I took a lot of "steps" to get to full blown alcoholism. I didn't plan to be an alcoholic. I didn't think my drinking would take me down the "steps" to hell.

Later in AA as I worked with my sponsor, I was taking a new set of "Steps." Step Four was not a difficult one for me. Then there were Steps Five through Nine!! For me these made for a steep climb. The effort has been worth it! I love being sober!!

Sixth Word "DEVELOPMENT" — the

act or process of creating something over a period of time.

Over time I have absorbed the Steps, although I didn't know that would happen when I started working them with my sponsor. It was true: "We will be amazed before we are half way through."

I was amazed when I woke up on the morning after I was admitted to treatment!! NO HANGOVER!!!!

Such a state was unimaginable at that point in my life. How well I remember the miserable mornings trying to get myself together enough to go to work. That morning was the beginning of my journey haven't had a hangover since.

And, not only was I nowhere

If we are painstaking about this phase of our development, we will be amazed before we are half way through.

We are going to know a new freedom and a new happiness.

We will not regret the past nor wish to shut the door on it. We will comprehend the word serenity and we will know peace.

No matter how far down the scale we have gone, we will see how our experience can benefit others.

That feeling of uselessness and self pity will disappear.

We will lose interest in selfish things and gain interest in our fellows. Self-seeking will slip away.

Our whole attitude and outlook upon life will change. Fear of people and of economic insecurity will leave us.

We will intuitively know how to handle situations which used to baffle us.

We will suddenly realize that God is doing for us what we could not do for ourselves.

Are these extravagant promises? We think not. They are being fulfilled among us —sometimes quickly, sometimes slowly. They will always materialize if we work for them.

My Seventh Tradition Checklist ...

1. Honestly now, do I do all I can to help AA (my group, my central office, my GSO) remain selfsupporting? Could I put a little more into the basket on behalf of the new guy who can't afford it yet? How generous was I when tanked in a barroom?

2. Should the Grapevine sell advertising space to book publishers and drug companies, so it could make a big profit and become a bigger magazine, in full color, at a cheaper price per copy?

3. If GSO runs short of funds some year, wouldn't it be okay to let the government subsidize AA groups in hospitals and prisons?

4. Is it more important to get a big AA collection from a few people, or a smaller collection in which more members participate?

5. Is a group treasurer's report unimportant AA business? How does the treasurer feel about it?

6. How important in my recovery is the feeling of self-respect, rather than the feeling of being always under obligation for charity received? The Seventh Step Prayer ...

My Creator, I am now willing that you have all of me, good and bad. I pray that you now remove from me every single defect of character Which stands in the way of my usefulness to you and my fellows. Grant me strength, as I go out from here, to do your bidding. Amen (P. 76 OF ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS, "THE BIG BOOK")
