

The 9th Step Principle...

Tradition Nine...

My Ninth Tradition Checklist...

- 1. Do I still try to boss things at AA?
- 2. Do I resist the formal aspects of AA because I fear them as authoritative?
- 3. Am I mature enough to understand and use all the elements of the AA program even if no one makes me do so with a sense of personal responsibility?
- 4. Do I exercise patience and humility in any AA job I take?
- 5. Am I aware of all those to whom I am responsible in any AA job?
- 6. Why doesn't every AA group need a constitution and by-laws?
- 7. Have I learned to step out of an AA job gracefully and profit thereby when the time comes?
- 8. What has rotation to do with anonymity? With humility?


A Ninth-S tep Prayer


