An Intimate Time of Personal Reflection

Coffee with God

On awakening let us think about the twenty-four hours ahead. We consider our plans for the day. Before we begin, we ask God to direct our thinking, especially asking that it be divorced from self-pity, dishonest or self-seeking motives. Under these conditions we can employ our mental faculties with assurance, for after all God gave us brains to use. Our thought-life will be placed on a much higher plane when our thinking is cleared of wrong motives. (Alcoholics Anonymous, pg.86).

This is a concept originally practiced by the Oxford Group as *Quiet Time*, a time for seeking guidance that was a mandatory practice for *OG* members.

I refer to it as an opportunity to be alone with God and have coffee with Him. It is intimate and personal, a time of focused communication with God, it is time spent with a friend, and it is one of several Step Eleven suggestions (beginning on page 85) found in our *Big Book*. It is not a requirement or mandatory, it is merely a suggestion that works ... if we have the right attitude.

But, like everything else in our literature, I have found that the way to achieve the promised results is to follow the suggestions, to do what our founders did, to remember that half measures avail me nothing.

This is a practice designed for quality time with God. It is not hurried. It is not done out of obligation, or a mere habit. It is a privilege and it establishes my connection with God for the next 24 hours and it improves with practice.

Practicing conscious contact with God and improving it as we go along certainly does a good deal more than eliminatee the booze problem. To leave it out of one's daily life is to miss the very purpose of living.

Step Eleven states that through Prayer and Meditation we are to establish *Conscious Contact* with God. But what exactly is "conscious contact with God?" How do you explain it?

plain the taste of chocolate. No possible explanation will do chocolate justice, it must be sampled and, once sampled, no explanations are necessary: you will know. What I can do is tell you how good chocolate is and how to find some, then it is up to you. It is the same with *Conscious Contact*. And it requires practice, discipline and commitment.

I used to think that if I did this, if I

I do this now because it is a pleasure, it is my duty and it is as natural as taking a breath of air. I am no longer making decisions but moving through each new moment effortlessly without deciding. There is no need to become involved in decision making because each new option before me becomes clear. It is a confident lifestyle, intuitive. When combined with a yearning and willingness to contact God, this simple consciousness, is something altogether different than the way I was before.

I believe it to be the essence of *Psychic Change*, and it has provided a new outlook on life.

The idea of establishing a personal relationship with a Supreme Being for the purposes of receiving guidance and direction is a widely held spiritual objective, shared by many religions, cultures, and philosophies, including the co-authors of *Alcoholics Anonymous*.

Once awakened and free of the obses-

sion to drink, three ideas designed to maintain that conscious state become relevant and are suggested in our literature:

- Continue to enlarge the spiritual life.
- Improve conscious contact with God.
- Grow along spiritual lines.

With these, my life stays on track, I stay on the *AA Beam* and I enjoy life completely free of the obsession to drink alcohol.

Being awake spiritually implies an ongoing state, a condition to be maintained. And, like coffee helps me stay awake in the physical realm, having coffee with God each morning helps me stay awake spiritually.

When I do this, there is a wonderful, personal peace of mind, a peace that passes all understanding, providing security, stability and happiness that defines my human experience.

I wish there was a way to adequately convey the ease of living and joy that comes to me, but I cannot. Like chocolate, like God consciousness, like being awake spiritually, these must be experienced for yourself.

Our description of the alcoholic, the chapter to the agnostic, and our personal adventures before and after make clear three pertinent ideas: That we were alcoholic and could not manage our own lives. 

My Seventh Tradition Checklist ...

- 1. Honestly now, do I do all I can to help AA (my group, my central office, my GSO) remain self-supporting? Could I put a little more into the basket on behalf of the new guy who can't afford it yet? How generous was I when tanked in a barroom?
- 2. Should the Grapevine sell advertising space to book publishers and drug companies, so it could make a big profit and become a bigger magazine, in full color, at a cheaper price per copy?
- 3. If GSO runs short of funds some year, wouldn't it be okay to let the government subsidize AA groups in hospitals and prisons?
- 4. Is it more important to get a big AA collection from a few people, or a smaller collection in which more members participate?
- 5. Is a group treasurer's report unimportant AA business? How does the treasurer feel about it?
- 6. How important in my recovery is the feeling of self-respect, rather than the feeling of being always under obligation for charity received?
